





We will attend Mass the oldest cathedral in North America, followed by a reverent






#### "THE BIG HOUSE" LOUISA PLANTATION

Denis P.J. Burguières designed and built, "The Big House," at Cypremort, around 1910, using the virgin cypress and pine from the family's timberlands.

In the late 1970s, due to the lack of occupation, disrepair, vandalism and liability, Edward Edmond Burguières had Louisa torn down.





In 1899, he received a U.S. Patent for a "Sugarcane Scraper," and in 1930, for "Method of Ripening Sugar Cane."

Denis married Alice Broussard, daughter of Frank Broussard and Ernestine Patout Broussard, both from pioneer families of south Louisiana. They had 8 children.

Denis P. J. Burguières died in 1936 at the age of sixty-two, having served the family business for over thirty-five years.



## THE CYPREMORT HOUSE

After Hurricanes Katrina and Rita in 2005, and Gustave and Ike in 2008, the Cypremort House was elevated 11 feet in 2009, to better protect it from storm surge and flooding.

As with all homes, the Cypremort House as well as the grounds are maintained and updated, routinely.

The latest improvements were completed in 2022. Colorful, pink azaleas were planted, an in-ground watering system was installed, concrete benches were placed, and several house repairs were made, too.
